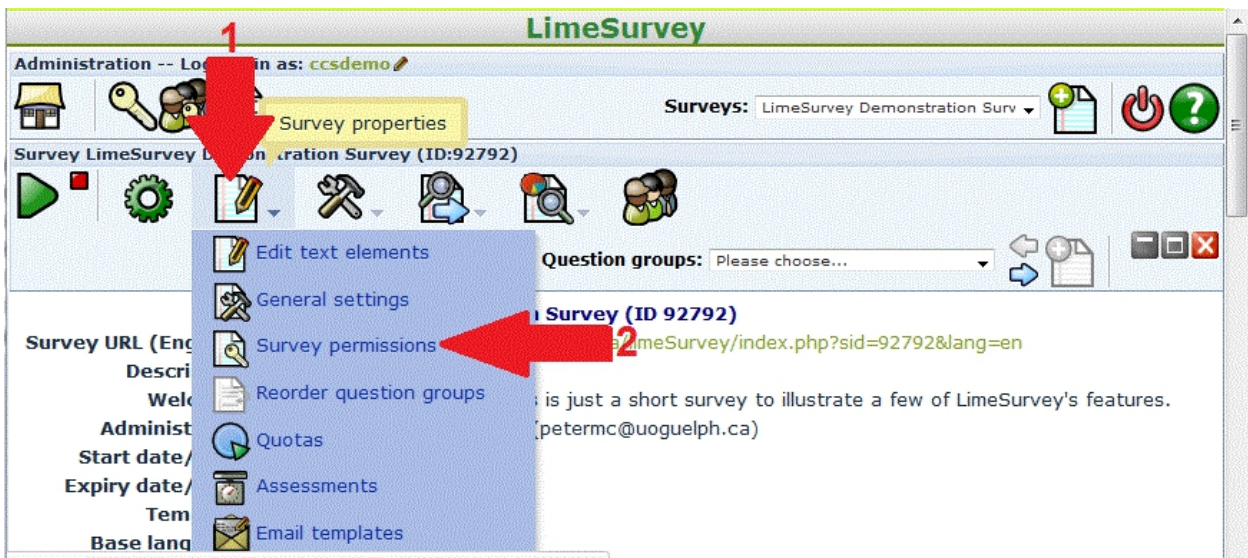

As the administrator of a survey in LimeSurvey, you may grant access rights to your survey to another LimeSurvey user. In granting rights, you can grant permission to edit your survey, delete your survey, view its results, export its results, etc. The person you are granting access rights to must have a LimeSurvey account.

To grant access rights:

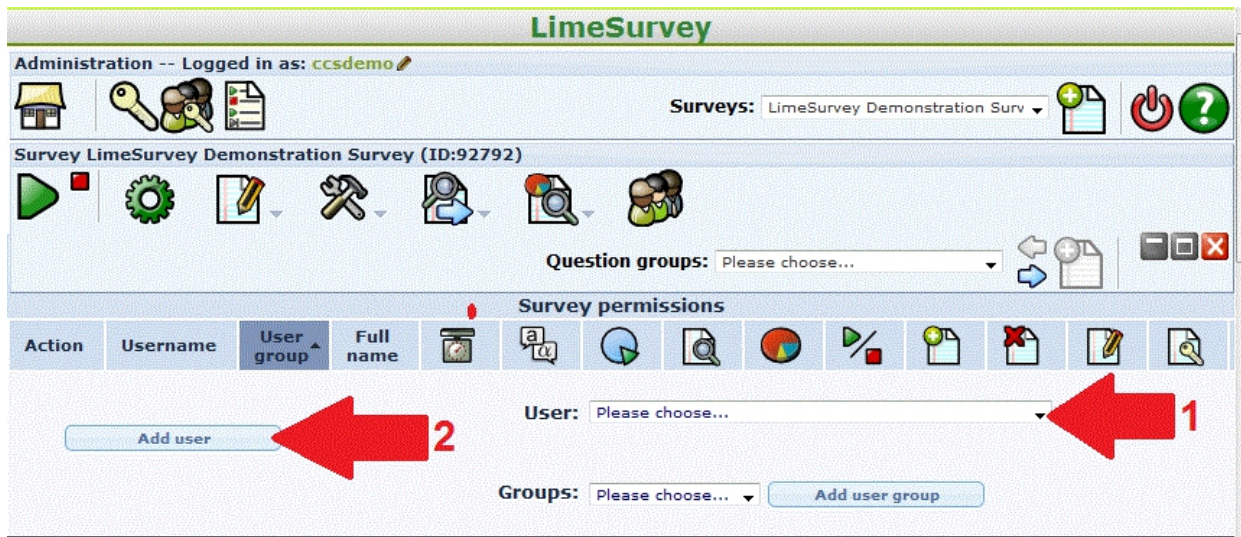
Step 1: On the Survey toolbar, move your mouse over the *Survey properties* icon (pointed to by red arrow 1 in figure 1 below) and click the *Survey permissions* choice from the resulting submenu as pointed to by red arrow 2 in figure 1 below.

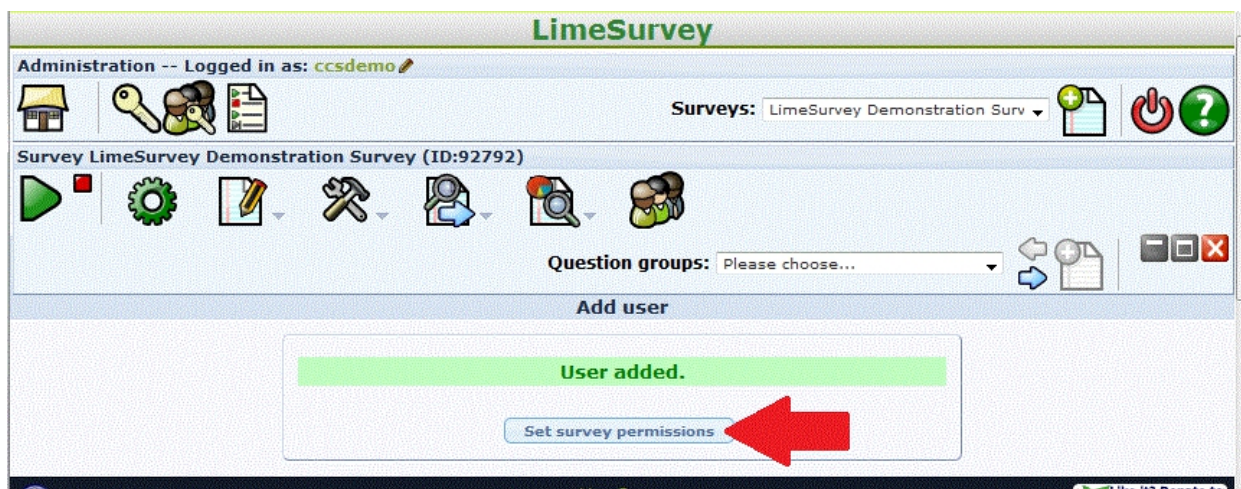
Step 2: Select the LimeSurvey user you wish to grant access rights to, from the list accessed by the drop-down arrow pointed to by red arrow 1 in figure 2 below. After you have selected the user from the list, click the *Add user* button pointed to by red arrow 2 in figure 2 below.

Step 3: Click the *Set survey permissions* button, as pointed to by the red arrow in Figure 3 below.

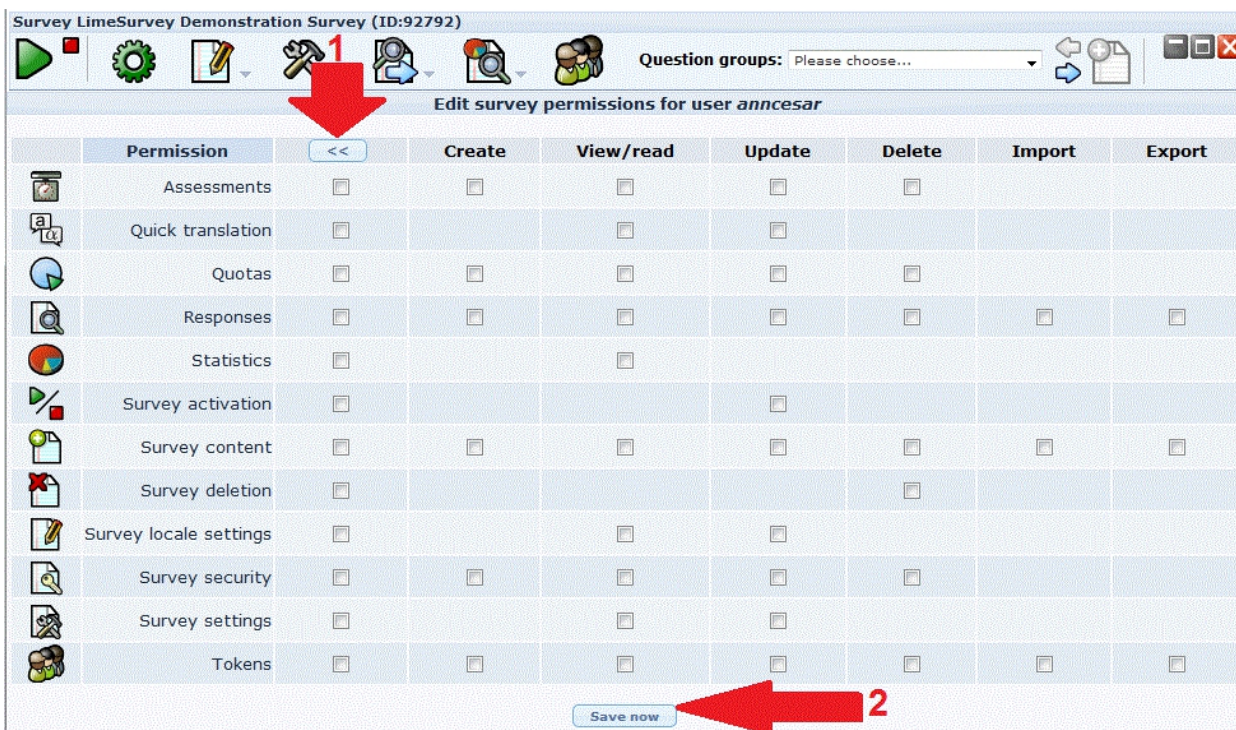

Step 4: Check the boxes corresponding to the various access rights you wish to grant the user for your survey. Checking a box in the column pointed to by red

arrow 1 in Figure 4 below grants all the rights in the corresponding row. To save your specifications, click the *Save now* button pointed to by red arrow 2 in Figure 4.
